# Family Programs Hawai'i

## 2010 Annual Report

The agency's commitment to bring together all aspects of the community to collaborate in serving children and their families was a greater priority in 2010 than in previous years. Economic conditions continued to worsen, contract and grant funding declined and child and family support resources disappeared. In this environment, providing comprehensive, high quality services became even more challenging. The situation necessitated reprioritizing, thinking more creatively, and focusing more intensely on community partnerships.

In September 2010, FPH took the opportunity to merge It Takes an 'Ohana (ITAO) into the agency. This program brings the "voice of foster parents" and supports our goal of helping families who care for children in the child welfare system. A new Fund Development Assistant position was added in September 2010 through the generosity of a donor/board member. We can now expand our community outreach and fundraising capability in the face of shrinking public sector resources.

Our Volunteer Program made great strides expanding volunteer recruitment, using volunteers creatively, and retaining volunteers to increase the agency's capacity and efficiency. Our generous volunteers gave special attention to the children in Ho'omalū O Na Kamali'i, provided child care for program activities, supported sibling visitation and events, helped with administrative duties, and assisted with fundraisers and community events.

Most importantly, we appreciate the many funders, supporters and friends who have donated their resources and time to support the various fundraisers, programs and campaigns FPH ran in 2010. Whether it was attending the Giovanna Goddess Gala, purchasing a virtual table for the Holiday Party for foster kids, securing a brick for Ho'omalū O Na Kamali'i or sending us a generous donation, your acts of kindness have helped change the lives of the children and families we serve.

Mahalo for helping us build community by supporting the important work that we do for our island Keiki and 'Ohana.

# Program Highlights

**Enhancement Services** provide abused and neglected children and children in foster care assistance with basic needs, school programs, special activities, proms and graduation, trips and more. FPH provided over 1,200 children special support to enhance their lives.

**Events**, including the Annual Summer Picnic in June and Holiday Party in December, brought extra joy to the lives of foster children and families, thanks to the many community partners, sponsors and volunteers that came together to give their support and time.

**It Takes An 'Ohana** helped foster and adoptive families learn about, respect and practice Native Hawaiian culture in their homes with their children, through the facilitation of statewide "Talk Story" sessions.

**Higher Educational Support Programs**, eXcel on O'ahu and Ho'ololi Mua No Ke Ola in Hilo, had success in supporting high school seniors pursue higher education. Last year, 45 youth transitioned from high school to postsecondary education.

**Ho'omalulu O Na Kamali'i** gave shelter to 115 children in 2010 and accommodated 28 sibling groups that

otherwise would have been split up into different homes. Of these children, 70 were of Hawaiian ancestry and 53 resided on the Waianae Coast.

**Long Term Foster Care** currently serves 50 youth in Honolulu and Hilo, assisting youth in developing the knowledge and skills needed for self sufficiency. Four youth graduated from high school. One youth graduated with a Bachelor of Science, and one young woman graduated from Medical School.

**Project Visitation** served 197 siblings from 58 families on O'ahu and 27 siblings from 10 families in Kona, Hawai'i. The program held four sponsored day events for separated siblings plus a 2-day overnight camp. Project Visitation was also featured at the international ISPCAN Congress as an innovative social service program.

**Resource Families Support Services** added Parent to Parent Mentoring outreach services to include Kaua'i resource families in 2010. O'ahu and Kaua'i resource families can now connect with an experienced mentor for additional support and guidance.

**Voluntary Case Management** supports at risk families in Leeward O'ahu to learn coping skills and parenting strategies to become successful parents. Of the 245 families served, Wai'anae represented 45% the total cases (110), Kapolei 15% (38 cases) and Ewa Beach 23% (57 cases).

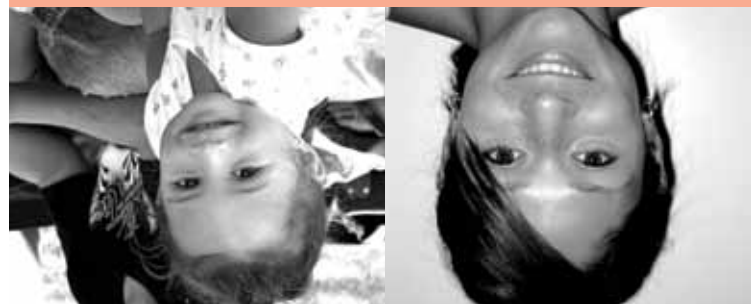


# Community Volunteers
